British Science Week


We will be completing activities during Science week. On Friday 13th March, we would like everyone to dress as up as a scientist or to bring in

<u>Safeguarding: Online Safety – Tik Tok</u>

We are finding a lot of problems with children's online activity outside of school time. We teach the children and advise you as school families about staying safe online; we have become worried by some of the behaviour we are hearing about when children are online. Often, children are using Tik Tok to socialise and are telling us that they are not always in the same room as parents/carers when online. Please remember that this site is not recommended for children under the age of 14, yet we have children as young as 7 and 8 using it. The age limit has been set for a reason. There may be issues that arise that are too mature for them and they may find it difficult to handle mentally/emotionally. Your son/daughter may not have any issues online and they are confident enough to tell you when something makes them uncomfortable, which is great, when used safely, the internet is a wonderful part of our lives.

Some staff have spent a lot of time dealing with children who are upsetting others whilst online. We would advise that you continue to be vigilant in making sure that your children are not left unsupervised whilst on the internet, so that you can monitor what is happening. We know that so many of you are so careful and already do this. I am sure that you would rather us spend time focussing on your son/daughter's learning than on time dealing with issues that have upset them whilst online at home over weekends and evenings.
